





Military & Civilians in Major DoD Acq Orgs, except DoD civilians assigned to maintenance depots (Shoppers)= 206,653

114,128 (55%) are non-DoD AT&L workforce personnel performing support functions, such as firefighting, police, human resources, administration, accounting, legal, engineering technicians, supply, transportation, and trades (such as equipment and facilities operations and maintenance).

92,525 (45%) are DoD AT&L workforce personnel performing Acquisition, Technology and Logistics functions directly.


Military & Civilians in DoD AT&L Workforce = 134,539

92,525 (69%) are DoD AT&L workforce personnel assigned to Major DoD Acq Orgs performing AT&L functions directly.

42,014 (31%) are DoD AT&L workforce personnel assigned outside Major DoD Acq Orgs performing AT&L functions for Commanders, Major Commands, Installations, Maintenance Depots, and the Defense Contract Audit Agency.




Acquisition Personnel, Dollars Obligated, and Contract Actions >\$100,000





Drawdowns DoD-wide vice Acquisition (in 000's)






- Based on acquisition-related duties and responsibilities of a position






DoD & DoD-Wide AT&L Military Workforce Years of Federal Service as of 30 Sep 2004

DoD Military Workforce






DoD & DoD-Wide AT&L Civilian Workforce (Sep 04) Regular Retirement Eligible
